



Reel in a big one at Scadding Court

It's that magical time of year once again when the folks at Scadding Court Community Centre bring fishing to the big city.

Starting Monday, June 14, inner-city youth and adults will be invited to make their way to the downtown west community centre's indoor pool for the annual Gone Fishin' Project.

The final line will be cast Saturday, June 19.

The temporary 'fishing hole' will be open to urban anglers weekdays from 3:30 to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

Members of the public pay a \$3 entry fee with each participant welcome to one fish. An additional fee of \$3.50 will be charged for those who exceed that limit. Cleaning costs 75 cents per fish.

School groups will go fishing at the local pool weekdays from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. They will be charged a \$75 flat rate to participate.

To ensure maximum participation from the community, fishing time may be limited to 40 minutes per visit.

The Scadding Court Community Centre is at 707 Dundas St. W., near Bathurst Street.
