



Score 'a keeper' at Scadding Court starting this Monday

Instead of having to leave the city to do a little fishing, the folks at Scadding Court Community Centre have once again brought fishing to the city.

During the popular annual Gone Fishin' Project the local community centre's indoor swimming pool is filled with 1,500 rainbow trout.

Each year, hundreds of Torontonians including dozens of school and specialty groups make their way to the pool near Dundas Street West and Bathurst Street for an urban fishing expedition.

The first line is set to be cast this Monday, June 15. Fishing season ends for this year at Scadding Court on Saturday, June 20.

The pool will be open to urban anglers weekdays from 3:30 to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

School and specialty groups are invited to try their hand at reeling in a big one weekdays from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. They will be charged a \$50 flat rate to participate.

Members of the public pay a \$2 entry fee with each participant welcome to one fish. An additional fee of \$3.50 will be charged for those who exceed that limit. Fish cleaning costs 75 cents per fish.

Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

To ensure maximum participation from the community, fishing time may be limited to 40 minutes per visit.
